


2022 Fishing Regulation Changes

The regulation changes below will be in effect for the May 7, 2022 fishing season opener except as otherwise noted. Check the <u>fishing regulations pamphlets</u> for fishing regulations on other waters and general statewide regulations.

Anvil Lake (Vilas County)	Walleye	18" minimum length limit except fish from 22-28" may not be kept, daily bag limit of 1
Bass Lake (Barron County)	Northern Pike	No minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of 5
Big Falls Flowage (Rusk County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Big Round Lake (Polk County)	Panfish	Daily bag limit of 10 in total (eff. April 1, 2022)
Buckatabon Lake, Upper and Lower combined (Vilas County)	Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	No minimum length limit, daily bag limit of 5 in total
Butternut Lake (Ashland/Price counties)	Muskellunge	Minimum length limit of 40", daily bag limit of 1

Clear Lake (Oneida County)	Walleye	18" minimum length limit except fish from 22-28" may not be kept, daily bag limit of 1
Cranberry Lake (Price County)	Panfish	Daily bag limit of 10 in total (eff. April 1, 2022)
Crowley Flowage (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Dairyland Reservoir (Rusk County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Escanaba Lake (Vilas County)	Walleye	Opens the second Saturday in June. 15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3 until an annual quota is met (announced locally), then catch-and-release to the first Sunday in March.
Elk River (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Flambeau River, including waters of the North Fork Flambeau River, between Turtle-Flambeau Dam and Thornapple Flowage Dam (Ashland, Iron, Price, Rusk, Sawyer counties)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Grassy Lake (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Katherine Lake (Oneida County)	Walleye	18" minimum length limit except fish from 22-28" may not be kept, daily bag limit of 1

Lac Sault Dore (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3

Lake Laura (Vilas County)	Walleye	18" minimum length limit except fish from 22-28" may not be kept, daily bag limit of 1
Loretta Lake (Sawyer County)	Panfish	Daily bag limit of 25 in total
Lower Park Falls Flowage (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Namekagon River from Trego Dam to the confluence with the St. Croix River (Burnett, Washburn counties)	Muskellunge	Minimum length limit of 50" and a daily bag limit of 1
North Nokomis Lake (Oneida County)	Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	No minimum length limit, 14-18" protected slot, only one may be over 18" long and a daily bag limit of 5 in total
Phillips Chain of Lakes (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3 chainwide
Pike Lake Chain (Price and Vilas counties)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3 chainwide
Pixley Flowage (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Presque Isle Chain (Vilas County)	Muskellunge	Minimum length limit of 50" and a daily bag limit of 1 chainwide

Schoolhouse Lake—managed as a chain with same regulations as Durphee Lake (Sawyer County)	Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	No minimum length limit, daily bag limit of 5 in total chainwide
	Panfish	Daily bag limit of 15, no more than 5 of each species chainwide
	Walleye	18" minimum length limit and daily bag limit of 3 chainwide
Solberg Lake (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
South Fork Flambeau River (Price, Rusk and Sawyer Counties)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3
Tiger Cat Chain of Lakes (Sawyer County)	Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	No minimum length limit, 14-18" protected slot, only one may be over 18" long and a daily bag limit of 5 in total.
Upper Park Falls Flowage (Price County)	Walleye	15" minimum length limit, walleye from 20-24" may not be kept, only one over 24" may be kept, daily bag limit of 3

Mill Creek from U.S. Highway 14 upstream to Quarry Hill Road (Richland County)	Trout	Maximum length limit of 12" and a daily bag limit of 5 in total
White Mound Lake (Sauk County)	Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass	No minimum length limit, 14-18" protected slot, only one may be over 18" long and a daily bag limit of 5 in total.
Willow Creek from Lost Hollow Rd upstream to STH 58 bridge 0.25 miles north of Loyd (Richland County)	Trout	Maximum length limit of 12" and a daily bag limit of 5 in total
